Waymarks

The route is waymarked with a distinctive **B** circled with arraws.

Imprint of the Gentry ...

This section of the Barnsley Boundary Walk reveals the imprint of historic houses and their surrounding parkland on the landscape.

At Cannon Hall the Spencer-Stanhope family established their fine country house, remodelled by John Carr of York from 1760. The mansion now houses art collections and the Museum of the 13th/18th Royal Hussars, and the parkland gardens provide a popular Country Park. Visitors are well cattered for and the adjoining open farm and garden centre provide added attractions.

Beyond the Cawthorne Park woodlands and the elevated High Hoyland village lies Bretton Hall, approached on our way by the airy gallops of Long Side. In the 18th, Century the Wentworth family developed their Hall and landscaped park at West Bretton. Today the house and parkland accommodate the Bretton Hall Campus of the University of Leeds, the Yorkshire Sculpture Park, a country park and nature reserve.
